€75m FOR SCHEME

A €75MILLION fund to boost export companies and create work was unveiled by the Government yesterday.

Enterprise Minister Richard Bruton said the Development Capital Scheme was "a critical element in the Action Plan for Jobs".

Mr Bruton told how it would support established Irish companies targeting significant revenue and jobs growth through export markets.

Corporate partners in the scheme, which targets mid-sized firms with turnover of up to €50million, include the Bank of Ireland, CRH plc, Glanbia plc and Glen Dimplex.

Those chipping in with expert advice include former Kerry Foods chief Denis Brosnan and ex Kentz boss Noel Kelly.

Minister Bruton said: "At the heart of our jobs plan is our determination to create a powerful engine of Irish enterprise alongside our strong multinational sector.

"Around the country we have many excellent mid-sized businesses in sectors like food, manufacturing and engineering – but we want to support more of them to grow bigger, export more and employ more people."
